Message to Shareholders

Dear Shareholders,

Doyon hosted another successful annual meeting of shareholders on March 18 in Fairbanks. Our quorum was several percentage points higher than in recent years; thank you to all those who voted in our annual election.



Re-elected to the board were Miranda Wright and Sonta Hamilton Roach. Joining the Doyon board of directors are Jerry Isaac and Brian Ridley. We also said goodbye to Lee DeWilde and Shirley Cleaver and want to thank them for their service to Doyon and our shareholders.

The executive leadership of the board is Wally Carlo, chair; PJ Simon, Jr., vice chair; Miranda Wright, treasurer; and Chris Simon, secretary. I look forward to another successful year of working with and implementing the direction of the board.

During the annual meeting, I was proud to report on fiscal year 2015, which saw Doyon's highest operating income in our history. I was also pleased to report on another strong year for shareholder employment and wages. The construction of Rig 142 was completed on time and under budget; we acquired a new information technology company, designData; and we were successful in securing wireless

spectrum bids in Auction 97. Much of Doyon's success is due to the diversity of our business lines and the hard work of our employees.

Doyon is prepared to face challenges in 2016, but we still expect to have another strong and profitable year. Doyon Drilling has two stacked rigs, but because of Rig 142, we have been able to keep many of our shareholder-employees working. The current situation with oil prices is very different than where we were last year, but because of our diversification, we fully expect to have the second-best year in our financial history.

Alaska's fiscal situation will certainly impact residents, communities, tribes and state services. Doyon is working with legislators to preserve funding in rural Alaska so that when cuts are made, they don't disproportionately affect the rural residents. I encourage you to stay informed and to contact your legislators to express your concerns.

Thank you for your continued support of Doyon and its employees.

Doyon Presents \$38,000 in Daaga' Award Grants

Doyon, Limited will present \$38,000 in Daaga' Award grants to 12 Interior organizations this year. The Doyon shareholder relations committee, comprised of board members Christopher Simon (chair), Sonta Hamilton Roach, Shirley Cleaver, Erica Frankson and PJ Simon, Jr., approved the grants in February.

Congratulations to the 2016 recipients, who are listed below along with a short description of how the grant funding will be used:

- **Chalkyitsik Village Council** – Summer Youth Camp will teach moose tanning, Native arts and language, and moose-hunting skills, while promoting a drug- and alcohol-free lifestyle.
- **Fairbanks Native Association** – Native Strong Culture Group will teach Native dancing, singing, drumming, making drums and regalia, and other activities related to Native culture.
- **Northway Village Council** – Ten Mile Cultural Camp will teach beading, cooking, mapping, whitefish cutting and smoking, moose hunting and drying, berry picking, boat safety, fish net checking, talking circles, Native dancing and language.
- **Carry the Cure, Inc.** – Iditarod Suicide Prevention Campaign will build awareness about suicide, domestic violence and substance abuse.
- **Nikolai Edzeno Village Council** – Family Wellness/Sobriety Week will honor Elders and community members, and host speakers who will discuss alcohol/drug prevention, historical trauma and how to heal.
- **Dancing with the Spirit** – Will work in the Doyon region to preserve Athabascan fiddling and dance traditions.
- **Nenana Native Association** – Summer Youth Fish Camp will focus on fishing and processing salmon, as well as learning traditional songs, dance and the Athabascan language.
- **Huslia Tribal Council** – Our Journey to Dakli Mountains will help to revive one of Huslia's nomadic hunting trips and host traditional hunting festivities.
- **Gwichyaa Zhee Gwich'in Tribal Government** – Muskrat/Ice Fishing/Vest Making events will include hunting and trapping muskrat, skinning and drying the hides, catching, preparing and storing fish, and sewing muskrat skins.
- **Ruby Tribal Council** – Camp Fire Youth Activities will include cold water and boat safety, swimming, cooking, nutrition, wellness, outdoor education and teen leadership activities.
- **Saakkaay Association** – Community events will include Memorial Day activities, Fourth of July parade, new instruments and a Kaiyuh fishing trip.
- **Koyukuk Tribal Council** – Culture Camp will include Elders, kids and other community members, and will teach fishing, berry picking, plants and the environment.

7(i) Distribution FAQs

The following are frequently asked questions that may answer shareholder questions about the 7(i) distribution.

What is the difference between Class A and B shares? Why do only Class B shareholders receive the distribution?

Class A settlement common stock was issued to original enrollees of Doyon, Limited in 1971 who also enrolled to a village corporation. The 7(i) distribution for Class A shareholders is sent to their village corporation.

Class B settlement common stock was issued to original enrollees of Doyon, Limited in 1971 who did not enroll to a village corporation. Since the Class B shareholder is not enrolled to a village corporation, they receive the 7(i) money directly.

Class C, D and E shareholders do not receive this distribution.

If Doyon mails the check on May 4, when will I receive it?

It depends on the postal delivery time.

Where does the 7(i) distribution come from?

The amount of 7(i) distributions varies depending upon the natural resource net profit of the regional corporations. Doyon receives money from other regional corporations throughout the year. Doyon keeps half the money and deposits the other half in an interest-bearing trust account. That money is then distributed to Class B (at-large) shareholders and village corporations in May.

My address is different from what Doyon has on file. What do I do?

To make address changes, call 1-888-478-4755, fax 907-459-2065 or email records@doyon.com by April 19 at 5 p.m. Alaska Daylight Time. Shareholders should also place a forwarding address on file with their post office. Shareholders with a bad address on file at Doyon will not receive their distribution, and need to contact shareholder records.

How do I apply for direct deposit?

Shareholders have until April 11 to apply for direct deposit. The direct deposit application is available at www.doyon.com or by contacting shareholder records.

When will checks be mailed? When will checks be direct deposited?

Checks will be direct deposited or mailed on May 4. Shareholders are encouraged to update their contact information as soon as possible and to have their checks direct deposited. The deadline to apply for direct deposit is April 11. Shareholders who want their check mailed and have moved must update their address with Doyon by April 19.

Can you hold my check?

No, all checks are mailed to shareholders or direct deposited into their bank accounts.

Can I pick up my check prior to it being mailed?

No. Checks are not available prior to the mailing date.

Can you trace my check?

No, shareholders will have to work directly with the post office.

Can my check be directly deposited to my bank?

Yes, shareholders can print a copy of the direct deposit form off the Doyon website at www.doyon.com or Doyon can fax a copy of the form to shareholders. The deadline for direct deposit applications is April 11.

How long is my check valid?

Checks are valid for six months; after that, the check needs to be reissued.

I lost my check, my check was stolen, etc. Can you stop payment?

Doyon can mail shareholders a stop payment form, which must be signed and returned. The earliest a stop payment action can be submitted to the bank is June 6. The bank holds it for 10 business days, and a check is then reissued five - 10 business days later. **Please use stop payments only as a last resort as stop payments take approximately two months and Doyon must pay a fee for every stop payment issued.**

If a shareholder believes their signature has been forged, Doyon can send paperwork for forgery and shareholders must contact local police to file a report.

I borrowed money and signed a letter relinquishing my 7(i) check. Can you send the check to the person who gave me the loan?

No, Doyon checks cannot be assigned to another person.

Can the IRS or child support garnish my Doyon check? Is my 7(i) subject to IRS backup withholding?

At this time, the 7(i) distribution is not subject to IRS backup withholding.

Child support can garnish the 7(i) distribution.

For specific cases, please contact the shareholder records department.

The custodian for a child is not who you have listed in their Doyon record. How can I get it changed?

For specific cases, please contact the shareholder records department.

Is this distribution taxable?

Yes, the 7(i) distribution is taxable income.

I didn't get my child (Class C) enrolled yet. Do Class C children get this distribution?

No, only owners of Class B stock receive this distribution.

I own the extra 100 shares of Elder stock (Class E). Do I get this check?

Even though shareholders may own Class B and E stock, only the Class B shares will be used in calculating the 7(i) distribution.

Elizabeth Fleagle: Hannah Paul Solomon Elder of the Year Award

Elizabeth "Betty" (Nictune) Fleagle was born July 20, 1935 near Alatna to the late Oscar Nictune, Sr. and Cora (Tobuk). Her Inupiaq name is Kavruk. Fleagle and her eight siblings were raised in a traditional way along the Alatna River. After their mother died, and until she was 13 years old, Fleagle was raised by her sister and brother-in-law, the late Elma and Frank Sam.



Fleagle is a mentor, spiritual counselor and inspiration to many of all ages in rural and urban Alaska, and imagines she will still be working in her 90s. When she is not busy with work, she enjoys beadworking and berry picking. Her advice to young people is, "You can be rich on your own no matter how hard it will be, you can get through everything. There is always hope. If you live an addiction-free life, it is so much easier." Her humor and independence allow her to live a richly blessed and spiritual life.

The Hannah Paul Solomon Elder of the Year award recognizes an Elder, age 55 or older, who has devoted his or her life toward the betterment of Alaska Natives. The award is named in honor of the late Hannah Paul Solomon, who dedicated her life to teaching the younger generation traditional ways.

Floyd Leroy Green, III is the son of Douglas Green, Sr. and Patty Wiehl. His paternal grandparents are the late Floyd

Lee often says, "We are all servants and should always serve others," and leads by example. She works with families and law enforcement to hold an annual gathering of remembrance for victims of unsolved homicides and raises awareness of the unsolved cases.

The Daaga' Community Service Award recognizes a community or individual who shows strong commitment, competence and sensitivity in helping others to make their community a healthier and safer place to live, and whose accomplishments have directly affected Alaska Natives.

Sherman Thomas: Gin'tith (Richard Frank) Military Service Award

Sherman Thomas was born in Northway to the late Silas and Eva Thomas. His grandparents are the late Walter and Lilly Northway of



Northway, and Peter and Sarah Thomas of Tanacross. Thomas was raised in Northway and Tanacross, along with his 11 siblings: Danny, Bertlyn, Bobby, Gary, Marjorie, Elizabeth, Evelyn, Benjamin and the late Bentley, Carolyn and Marvin.

Thomas was drafted by the U.S. Army to fight in the Vietnam War and served in Infantry until 1969. On January 26, 1969, Thomas distinguished himself while serving as an automatic rifleman with Company A, 4th Battalion, 21st Infantry. During a combat sweep operation in the vicinity of Quang Ngai City, the third platoon came under heavy automatic weapons fire from a well-concealed enemy position, seriously wounding one man. Thomas, without concern for his own personal safety, raced through the intense enemy fire to reach the injured man. Displaying exceptional courage, he again moved through hostile fire as he carried the wounded man to safety. Thomas displayed personal heroism, professional competence, and devotion to duty in keeping with the highest traditions of military service and in reflecting great credit upon himself. For this, he received the Silver Star on March 13, 1969.

The Gin'tith (Richard Frank) Military Service Award recognizes an Alaska Native who demonstrates a strong commitment and willingness to serve in the U.S. armed forces in the defense of the United States of America.

Subsidiary Update: DUS Security Division Expands in Texas

On June 2013, the Doyon Universal Services (DUS) security division began their first project in Carrizo Springs, Texas with Anadarko Petroleum, in an area known as the Maverick Basin in the Eagle Ford Shale. DUS currently operates 14 access control posts on ranch leases and critical infrastructure sites for Anadarko.

In February 2016, DUS renewed their security contract with Anadarko for another three years and took over as the only security provider for Anadarko in the Maverick Basin. This growth will add approximately 30 more security officers and expand DUS' footprint in the Eagle Ford until March 2019.

Anadarko Petroleum is also making some changes in this expansion, by investing in technology to improve physical safety measures. These investments include the use of electronic gates, which will be installed at posts with

minimum traffic, and card reader scanning systems for expedited access and egress. Although this technology may reduce the number of officers at post, a physical security presence on lease property remains a top priority for Anadarko. As a result, DUS will see a more robust roving patrol system in the Maverick Basin.

"We are very proud of our men and women who are the face of DUS in Texas," said Cal Kaiser, DUS Texas security director. "The success and growth in south Texas is a direct reflection of the Anadarko project. We value our partnership with Anadarko and we are very excited about our future and growth potential in the lower 48 because of this project."
